Attendance:

I would like to clarify some details regarding student attendance and the information you see on Hero for your child's attendance.

Attendance is recorded in half days;

- first half 9.00am to 2.00pm (up to an including lunchtime),
- second half 2.00pm to 3.00pm (after lunch).

I understand that they are not equal half days but this is the easiest way to record attendance.



Each time a child is absent from school the office records the absence and assigns it to a code depending on the information parents provide about the absence:

- D Medical appointment
- M Illness
- J Justified absence like; school sports event, bus or car breakdown, road closure, extreme weather conditions

All of the above are considered as justified absences.

- E- Explained, but unjustified; staying home as family is visiting, birthday, going to a performance/concert etc
- G Holiday during term time

Both E and G codes are considered unjustified.

Our school attendance data is sent automatically to the Ministry of Education weekly and at the end of each term they provide us with termly data. If the MOE have any concerns regarding attendance they contact the school directly. This is only done in severe cases and in my time at Pāuatahanui School I have not been contacted by the MOE regarding student attendance.
