Being SunSmart:

The children have been pretty good in week 1 with wearing their hats when they are outside in the sun. We recommend and encourage the children to wear wide-brimmed hats like bucket hats. Teachers also encourage children to apply sunscreen. If your child is unable to apply sunscreen can you please let their teacher know. Can we please ask that your child's hat (and all clothing) be named. This makes it much easier to reunite lost hats and clothing with their owners.

Road Patrol:

Caregivers contact form:

Drop off and pick up:

Pick up:

Can we please ask that you do not drop your children at school before 8.30am unless they are attending sKids. Teachers use the time before 8.30am to prepare for the day so children are not actively supervised before 8.30am.

Drop off:

Pick up is 3.00pm or near this time unless children are attending sKids or they are on a school bus which leaves school at 3.30pm.

A friendly reminder that the turning bay outside the school is a place to turn around and to pick children up who are waiting there. It is not a place to park and leave your car and walk up to school. Thank you to those who use this space appropriately. We also need to be considerate to our local businesses and neighbours and not park over their driveways and parks designated for their customers.
